

#### 100 "Smart Cities" in India

After the successful first edition in May 2015, Indus Media will again host the second "100 Smart Cities in India" conference on Tuesday 31st of May in Berlin at the Metropolitan Solutions 2016.

On behalf of the <u>Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature</u> <u>Conservation, Building and Nuclear Safety (BMUB)</u>, and with partners such as <u>National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA)</u> and <u>Asia-Pacific Forum Berlin e.V</u>, the conference will bring together government representatives, industry leaders, and leading companies from both sides on a common platform to exchange, understand, deliberate and collaborate on ideas and technologies to modernise Indian cities.









During the recent joint working group meeting in New Delhi, State Secretary *Gunther Adler* of the German Ministry for Environment, Nature Conservation, Building and Nuclear Safety has announced that Germany would contribute to India's Smart Cities programme, namely to projects in *Kochi, Bhubaneswar and Coimbatore*.

To continue the bilateral discussion and strengthen cooperation in Smart Cities sector, the German Government has invited representatives of the three Indian cities and the Ministry of Urban Development to participate in the conference in Berlin. The panel discussions and sessions are designed to inspire and share constructive solutions for sustainable urban development in India.

At the third Inter-Governmental Consultations (IGC) held in New Delhi in October 2015, the Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi and the German Federal Chancellor Dr. Angela Merkel agreed to steer the Strategic Partnership between India and Germany into a new phase by building on their growing convergence on foreign and security issues and on the complementarities between the two economies.

The leaders welcomed the recent convening of the Joint Working Group on Sustainable Urban Development that would serve as a forum to help identify three cities for bilateral collaboration. Among the priority areas identified by the Prime Minister for close collaboration with Germany are those relating to renewable energy, water management, urban waste management and energy efficiency. The intensification of high-level engagement would provide new opportunities for German companies in the urban development sector offered by India's initiative on 100 Smart Cities.






